

- ♦ What short, medium and long term opportunities exist to improve non-motorized travel along and across the Pal/Willow corridor? (For example, what other planning and construction schedules should we be aware of?) What are the challenges and constraints?

Next Steps

- ♦ Data Collection: What additional information should be collected to help us recommend feasible improvements to the walking and biking environments in the corridor? Who is available to assist with fieldwork? Can we schedule some field visits for January? Are there other types of studies we should do?

- ♦ Making Recommendations: CATS produced technical reports for the Villages of Arlington Heights (in draft form) and Northfield to identify needs and offer suggestions for improving walking and biking conditions. Should we use this approach in the other communities? If so, how can we improve the reports? If not, how should the results of the study be presented?

- ♦ Workshops: There has been discussion of doing Walkable Communities workshops for interested communities, starting in April. These workshops could address pedestrian issues that go beyond needs in the Pal/Willow corridor. Interest also has been expressed in doing a Bicycle Facilities Tour and Workshop to assess bicycle connections between communities and to area destinations. Is there still interest in these events?
